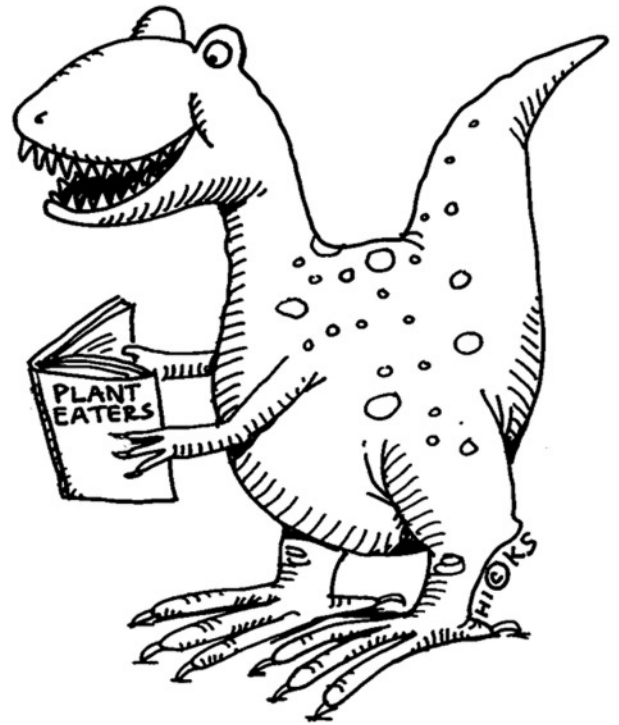

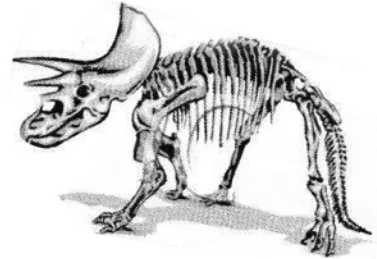

The word dinosaur means "terrible lizard" in Greek.



Dinosaurs lived on Earth until around 65 million years ago. Then they became extinct (they all died). Some scientists believe this happened when a meteor hit the earth, making the air very dusty and shady, and too cold for the dinosaurs to survive. Brrr!

The reason we know about dinosaurs today is through fossils. These are bones and other parts that were buried in mud and replaced by minerals. What was once living bone is now a rock in the shape of a bone.



Dinosaur fossils have been found in Utah. There is even a dinosaur called the Utahraptor. It was about the size of a grizzly bear and hunted in packs. It was probably one of the speediest dinosaurs, running as fast as an ostriche, up to 43 miles an hour. It had claws 9 inches long! Watch out!!

A Tyranosaurus Rex (or T-Rex) could have teeth 8 inches long! OUCH!



Seismosaurus was the longest dinosaur. It was up to 115 feet long, about 4 school buses.

The tallest dinosaur we know about is the Ultrasaurus, about 80 feet high. They ate leaves like a giraffe, moved very slowly, and weighed up to 80 tons. That's as much as 17 elephants!



The largest dinosaur eggs discovered are about a foot long, a bit longer than a football. Mother dinosaurs laid multiple eggs – from three to 20 at a time.
